# Knowledge Sessions Shaping the Dairy Future

Day Two of the conference featured deep-dive sessions focused on strengthening modern dairy production systems, addressing the urgent need for improved herd productivity, climate-adaptive feeding strategies and precision livestock management. **Experts deliberated on how digital advisory platforms, sensor-based monitoring and integrated farm management tools can significantly improve animal welfare, reduce operational losses and enhance farm profitability.**

Another **important session explored processing technologies and automation, highlighting advancements in hygienic design, energy-efficient processing lines, smart CIP systems and digital quality monitoring frameworks.** Speakers underlined the need for Indian processors to adopt global best practices to meet stringent export standards and growing domestic quality expectations.





# Knowledge Sessions

## Innovation, Sustainability & Global Outlook

A dedicated session on Dairying @2047 examined India's long-term vision of becoming a globally competitive dairy powerhouse by aligning technology investments, policy reforms, skill development and cooperative modernisation. Discussions also focused on building climate-resilient dairying systems, particularly through heat-stress management, sustainable feed solutions and water-efficient processing operations.

Sessions on emerging technologies, artificial intelligence and IoT showcased how predictive analytics, digital traceability and smart diagnostics can redefine dairy operations from farm to factory. The conference further featured powerful conversations on women-led dairy enterprises, emphasising leadership, entrepreneurship and access to technology for women producers. The programme concluded with focused deliberations on milk standards, regulatory harmonisation and the globalisation of Indian dairy products, reinforcing the roadmap for expanding India's footprint in international markets.


